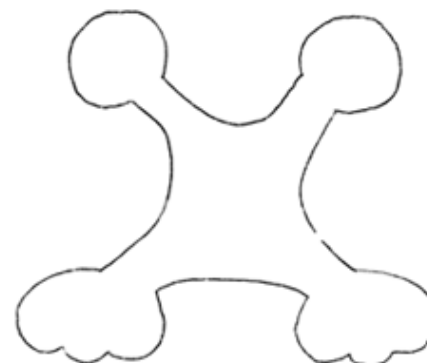
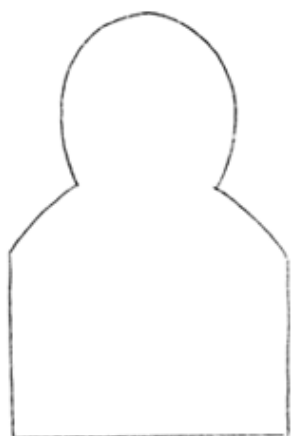

Here's a few additional tips on putting your projects together once they're all painted! Add any customizations with paint before starting to put it all together. Be sure the paint is dry and smooth before putting it all together.



DRAW YOUR FACES!

Here's how we drew our cute little faces but you can draw them however you'd like! We usually use a black sharpie to draw faces and write on our crafts but a ballpoint pen works really well too if you don't have a sharpie! Faces will probably be easier to draw AFTER gluing things together so you can see where it all goes. PENGUINS: don't forget to paint the little yellow beaks.

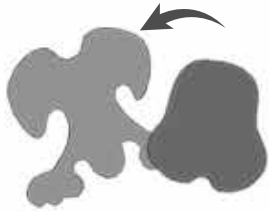

PUTTING IT TOGETHER

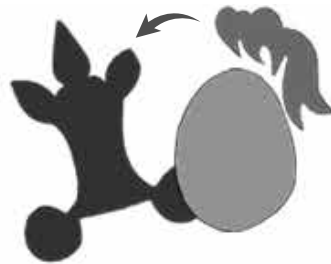

School glue works great at gluing things together but it will require a bit of patience to wait for it to dry. If you have adult supervision a hot glue gun works really well too!



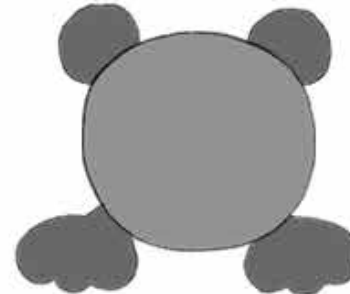
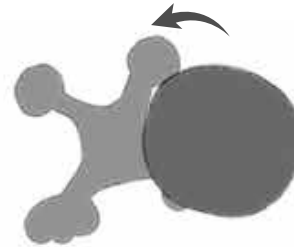

FINISHING IT UP!

Next you glue your cute animal friend to the valentine heart. All the animals connect to the front of the heart EXCEPT the penguin.



Attach your animal to the front of the heart like this picture above. The paws, feet, or hooves are used to connect the animal to the heart. Be extra patient waiting for the glue to dry.



Attention Penguins!!!
The penguin gets attached
BEHIND the heart.
